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## A young player with a bright future

Josh Bayliss grew up in a town in South West England and he went to school near there. When Josh was 10, he tried rugby at school and soon after he played for the school team. Then Bath Rugby Club invited him to join their schoolboy team and in 2014 he started playing for their under-18 team. Josh went to Millfield School, which is well-known for its sports. Pupils can choose from over 30 different sports and there are around 100 coaches to help them. A large number of the pupils from the school enter international sports competitions every year.

In September 2015, Josh began his last year of school, so he had to study hard. He also wanted to play for the England under-18 rugby team, so he needed to find time to practise. Josh plays at the back of the team and during the match he has to run a lot. He needs to be stronger, faster and fitter than other players because he wants to play against the best teams in the world. He also needs to look after himself and he should be careful about what he eats.







Josh finished school in June 2016. Two months later he travelled to South Africa with the England under-18 rugby team. The team played well but they lost all three of their matches. Their coach said that it was bad luck, but he thinks that they will be a very good team in the future. Josh is now playing for England's under-19 team and he may be on the England rugby team at the next Rugby World Cup. He certainly hopes so!
