

Учебное пособие для подготовки к ГИА по английскому языку: грамматика и лексика поможет учащимся подготовиться к сдаче экзамена по английскому языку в формате Государственной (итоговой) аттестации выпускников 9 классов, а также может быть использовано как начальный этап подготовки к сдаче выпускного экзамена в 11 классе в формате Единого государственного экзамена по английскому языку. Пособие содержит интернет-ресурс, который позволяет существенно дополнить и разнообразить процесс подготовки к итоговой аттестации и организовать самостоятельную работу учащихся.
