

Technology Assisted Language Learning with Gavin Dudney

50 hours face-to-face course in Norwich
17 - 28 July 2017

The course includes **intensive tuition** by trainers who are **experts** in the field of Information Technology in language teaching, as well as opportunities for reading and research and a guest lecture from a well-known figure in the field of ELT.



Gavin Dudney is Director of Technology for The Consultants-E - working in online training and consultancy in EdTech – and module leader (MATALL) on the NILE / University of Chichester MA in Professional Development for Language Education (MAPDLE). Former Honorary Secretary and Chair of EICOM at IATEFL, he now serves on the International House Trust Board and on the Educational Writers Group Committee of the Society of Authors. Gavin is author of *The Internet & The Language Classroom* (CUP 2000, 2007) and co-author of the award-winning publications *How To Teach English with Technology* (Longman 2007) and *Digital Literacies* (Routledge 2013). His latest book, *Going Mobile*, was published by DELTA Publishing in 2014.

- Classes will be **practical and 'hands-on'** but with **reference to relevant theory**
- Courses are **participant-centred** and entail involvement in tasks and activities which **boost confidence** and provide **memorable learning contexts**
- Tasks will be used to illustrate the key course objectives through **procedure as well as content**

This course will cover some or all of the following aspects:

- Applications software for language teachers, e.g., word processors and presentation software
- The **creation and use** of multimedia materials based on commercially and freely available software and shareware
- Accessing **language corpora** and using **concordances and text analysis** programmes to create language materials for the classroom
- Core skills for the Internet, such as **searching, creating and evaluating web pages** communicating through forums, conferencing etc.
- Experience with Read/Write web technologies such as **wikis** and **blogs**, and also with **podcasts**
- Access to professional development through **participating in the ELT international community** via the internet
- An opportunity to complete a **small-scale project involving e.g. lesson plans, e-learning materials, website design**
